Our Obon moved into social media because of the pandemic. We should not forget that our experience is all the more important because of the circumstances we are in. We are unable to do things in the same way as we have in the past. But we can find new and different ways to stay connected. For many, the changes that we have had to make have been overwhelming. Separated, isolated, unable to even go outside has caused many to feel depressed, frustrated and angry. It has taken me weeks to regain my footing. There is still much work to be done. Not easy. Very unsettling and sometimes overwhelming. But an important part of becoming stable again has been acknowledging the new patterns that the changes have brought.

When shelter in place began it felt almost like a lark. We would comply with the changes in behavior that would help stop the spread of the disease. Staying at home seemed like a break. But as the days, weeks and now months have passed we find ourselves having to make decisions that our lives depend on. Now with nearly half a year passed, with no end in sight, the realization that our lives and how we behave has changed. We know that in order to get through this we must work together. We cannot think selfishly about what I need or want. For all of us to survive I must consider how my actions will affect the health and well being of others.

You and I must be responsible. The action of the Betsuin can, under some circumstances, directly affect the lives of the community. These actions take place through organizations and groups of individuals. As individuals our actions have great importance. Relying on the organization when necessary but acting as independent individuals when we can. In this time of isolation it is more important than ever to reach out as individuals to friends and family. Our Obon@Home demonstrated how much just chatting with people online can mean. Each of us have people we are connected to, to check in with once in awhile. Let them know you're still thinking about them.

Okagesama to everyone Etsuko Mikame

This year due to the COVID-19, we decided to cancel our annual in-person Obon festival. But, we were fortunate to share that we host an Obon@Home with many people from the comfort of their homes in place of our in-person Obon festival. I think we were able to enjoy Obon@Home because of the hard work of many individuals. Especially the enthusiasm and expertise of people

working hard behind the scene made this event possible and successful. So, I would like to appreciate their selfless contributions to make this project possible. - 4. Over 26,000 viewers and 700 additional followers on Instagram.
- 5. There were very good responses from the local businesses for the free online advertisement.
- 6. As of July 29, \$196,554 generated as part of the "In Memory Of" Giving Campaign.
- 7. Over 8 hours of material (19 video segments) with live segments interspersed throughout the day.
- 8. Over 30 ads by various businesses and organizations including a public service announcement from the City of San Jose.

Mission Statement:

Motions and Guest Presentations

- 1. Review of June 4, 2020 Meeting Minutes: Motion passed to approve June Board Meeting Minutes.
- 2. Mikame-sensei's friend, Momo-san street art update. There is a time saps photography of Momo-san creating her fish pond drawing. Momo-san and two other friends would like to create 3 new drawings. Board passed motion to permit new drawings.
- 3. Fundraising opportunity on eBay: Steve Onishi talked to Mike Mori, who offered a fundraiser proposal on eBay. Motion was made and passed.
- 4. Japantown Business parking space rentals being charged with no customers, motioned to not charge rental parking from March to August 2020. Motion passed.
- 5. President-Elect Committee nominated Steve Onishi as the new incoming President. Motion to announce Steve Onishi as the President-Elect. Motion passed unanimously.

Meeting Reports

- 1. Surveillance camera installation: All cameras are installed. Video can be viewed but it is not storing. Best is working to find the problem
- 2. Food Bank food distribution going well
- 3. Loaves and Fishes sandwich requests scuttled because bread was not available. Plans are to make 500 sandwiches in coming weeks.
- 4. New Board Meeting structure and Bylaws changes to streamline the decision-making process smoother and quicker in the future. Change number of board directors is not a priority and not necessary. If this section is to be changed, the Sangha needs to approve the change at the annual meeting held in December. The quorum must stay at 17. Other changes to the Bylaws are internal. Section to be clarified will be the following: a) succession process, b) meetings process, c) new board structure. Gene Takagi, Betsuin attorney will review and return by August board meeting.
- 5. Removal of parking along Jackson and Taylor Streets: The Silicon Valley Bike Coalition would like to put bike lanes on Jackson and Taylor from 1st Street to 9th Street. The subject will be on the city's agenda on July 19th. Letters sent to council members as well as the bike coalition group and Dept. of Transportation to object to this proposal. Request was made for everyone to send messages to District 3 associates to Councilman Raul Paralez.
- 6. Ministerial report announced Obon service guest speaker will be Rev. Earl of the New York Buddhist Church, who will be Zoomed in. An Obon program is being created with many different elements. A dress rehearsal will be held this Sunday, July 5th. Obon program will be held on July 11th from 12-9pm on Zoom.
- 7. Budget and Finance reported a question of extra \$60,000. Question is: Is this the extra money in salary from the government stimulus package that was requested jointly with Lotus. Diane Fujioka to verify.
- 8. Communications: AV system wiring between the Hondo and annex is not working. The camera works, but the remote does not. They had to use laptop to make it work. Issue is being worked. The virtual Dharma will be on line soon. Sally Idemoto has sent the PDF files. If this continues, Kevin will need to get articles sent to him. See written report.
- 9. Membership is working on on-line membership.
- 10. Youth reported Baccalaureate Service went well. Good trial run for the Obon program.
- 11. Sangha Support Committee has been working on Project Gratitude. It has been very successful. There are 42 people who were recognized. There still is \$1,000 left in Project

Gratitude. Thank you to the committee for working so hard on this project.

- 12. Obon Committee: Mas Nishimura is busy coordinating the virtual Obon day, July 11 from 12-9pm. There will be an Obon dancing section, Buddhism 101, Taiko, Kimono dressing, etc. Practice day will be on Tuesday.
- 13. EcoSangha conducted an art contest, normally part of Earth Day. Winners were sent cash prizes. An article will be placed in The Dharma (electronic) and an article and photos will be on the Betsuin website. Continue collecting shoes, cartridges and Styrofoam for recycle.
- 14. Garden Committee: Volunteers continue tidying up the garden area and walkway to the office.
- 15. Incident at Foster's Freeze; Someone witnessed person acting very violent. He was cursing, saying he was going to kill her, asked for water at Foster Freeze window, grabbed the credit card machine, stole the tip jar. Police were called and they were able to apprehend him. Be careful when you are out and about.

Obon @ Home Reiko Iwanaga

San Jose Buddhist Church Betsuin history was made on July 11, 2020 when our first (and, hopefully, only) Virtual Obon was presented, streaming on Facebook. Led with quiet and calm confidence by Virtual Obon chair, **Mas Nishimura**, a committee developed a program in a short time.

The eight hours of Obon@Home programs came together in about two months through weekly Zoom calls. The reaction was overwhelming. More than 16,000 people from all over the world either watched it live or afterwards and more than 600 people donated to the "In Memory Of" Campaign or bought Obon@Home clothing. Overall the event raised more than \$200,000 for the temple, the most ever for an Obon festival.

Congenial masters of ceremonies, **Dennis Akizuki** and **Jeff Ota**, kept the program lively and informative, recalling memories of past Obons, enhanced by their own long family histories. They provided transitions between pre-filmed segments, aided by a hardworking tech crew: **Mas Nishimura, Duane Kubo, Mitchell Beutler, Matt Ogawa, Ken Furukawa, Alvin Hironaga, Janice Doi, Steve Doi, Paul Endo, Kevin Kitagawa** and **Matt Fukuichi**.

The program opened with a welcome from **Rinban Gerald Sakamoto**, followed by a short history of the Obon Odori and an invitation to dance by **Reiko Iwanaga**, Obon Odori teacher. These segments were edited by **Duane Kubo**.

Dennis Akizuki, past Obon chair, interviewed **Jim McClure**, Obon chair for 19 years, and **Ken Kamei**, current chair. They recalled the enormous work and challenges involved in putting on the festival, reciting remembrances of past events and the evolution of techniques, manpower and efforts. **Ted Nakano** edited this video and the yukata tutorial.

Paul Endo created the enticing cooking segments of Obon foods. A cookbook, prepared by **Kathy** and **Elanor Sakamoto**, with layout by **Mitch Beutler**, contains recipes of traditional Obon food, with interesting fun facts. It is available on the website.

Moschel Kadokura, aided by Lynne Yamaichi, presented a tutorial on yukata dressing with

helpful visual tips. This is an essential and useful element for Obon Odori preparation. Various instructional Obon videos created by **Alex Ruemmler, Miya Uenaka** and **Kailey Wong** for their Silver Scout Award were also available.

Nostalgia was an emotional aspect of the afternoon, aided greatly by the 'Faces of Obon' segment coordinated by **Gloria Yamauchi** and the "Natsukashii" portion handled by **Paul Endo**. The latter included a segment with **Kaye Masatani** and **Elaine Ando** who recalled many of their experiences as well as those of beloved late Sangha members.

Buddhism 101 has always been an important component and, thus, a virtual service and Q&A were held in the Hondo. **Rinban Sakamoto, Rev. Mikame** and **Michael Jones** provided a reminder of the religious foundation of this special festival and answered queries from the public.

To support local businesses, **Janice Doi** contacted Japantown stores and restaurants and others and offered free ads. These were lively additions, as many restaurants provided samples of their culinary offerings throughout the broadcast, probably inducing longings for favorite foods in the viewing audience.

An intermittently live presentation, corrdinated by **Rev. Etsuko Mikame**, was an ongoing activity of sidewalk mural painting by artist, **Momo Cha**, aided by artists, **Yurika Chiba** and **Addie McClure**. The audience was able to watch as a beautiful mural titled, "May Peace Prevail Throughout the World" was completed. Time-lapse photos and video by **Mike Mori** and **Chisa Matsunaga**, respectively, captured the creative process.

Music, an important component of our Obon, was fully represented by a delightful video segment from San Jose Taiko, a charming Chidori Band retrospective assembled by **Gloria Yamauchi** and taped performances by various collegiate taiko groups: **Seattle University, Cal Poly Pomona, UC San Diego, Cal State Northridge, UCLA, UC Irvine, Stanford, Cornell, UC Berkeley, Swarthmore College, UC Davis**. All the musical ensembles must be thanked for embracing this activity with enthusiasm and creativity.

Binding the entire enterprise together was the Obon Go-Fund-Me segment developed and managed by **Janice Oda**. "In Memory Of" and "In Honor Of" categories inspired many to donate throughout the broadcast. The opportunity for personal and emotional interaction resulted in record fundraising results, as reported earlier, and even exceeded last year's high revenue.

Enlarging the donor base and viewership were the efforts of **Mitch Beutler** and **Matt Ogawa** who spent many weeks building our presence on Facebook and other social media sites. Due to these efforts, we had 12,000 viewers when it was live and now have over 16,000, including those from many states, Japan, Ireland and London.

Merchandise displaying the clever logo created by **Mitch Beutler** was available for sale. The t-shirts, aprons, tote bags will be a touchstone to this pandemic year and were entirely handled by Mitch. For younger audiences, craft projects created by **Lynne Yamaichi** and Lotus Preschool were on our website and our chair, **Mas Nishimura**, developed an intriguing and challenging online scavenger hunt.

As per usual in a normal year, the Obon Odori was the last experience in the program. **Reiko Iwanaga** coordinated a zoom recording of dancers culled together by a spontaneous call-out. Technically handled by **Duane Kubo, Dennis Akizuki** and **Mas Nishimura**, the hope was that people would dance in their living rooms and, based on that concept, Reiko selected the public's favorite dances. **Alvin Hironaga's** videos of past Obons were also incorporated. The crew that handled the integration of live and filmed portions was the absolute essential 'glue' that resulted in a home-grown, yet professional, program. The studio was the multipurpose room with multiple devices and technical skills involved. This crew, working within sheltering guidelines, was so committed to delivering the program that they should be mentioned again: **Rinban Sakamoto**, **Rev. Mikame, Mas Nishimura, Mitch Beutler, Matt Ogawa, Ken Furukawa, Alvin Hironaga, Janice Doi, Steve Doi, Paul Endo**, and our emcees, **Dennis Akizuki and Jeff Ota. Kevin Kitagawa** and **Matt Fukuchi** helped with the Annex networking.

Many others were involved in the myriad tasks involved in this unusual activity and they included **Steve Onishi, Randy Suzuki, Deborah Aso, Garage Champs**, the spontaneous **Zoom Obon Odori dancers, Jr. YBA** and many others. Photographers, **Scott Nakajima** and **Joe Na** were essential to the program. Apologies are extended to others whose names may have been inadvertently missed.

San Jose's Virtual Obon is completed and is a testament to the commitment of Sangha members to present an Obon experience, even during this pandemic. As we all danced in joy to "Obon no Uta" and remembered our loved ones with gratitude, the goals of spiritual, emotional and personal connections and memories were reached. Much appreciation is extended to **Mas Nishimura**, Virtual Obon Chair, and his Committee for this truly successful Obon Festival.
